Two newborn girls found abandoned

JALANDHAR: Two newborn baby girls have been found abandoned in the Jalandhar City. While one was found left in the Cradle at Unique home on April 24th. Week after the other was found in the bush outside Jalandhar.

The identity of their parents could not been known and they had been admitted to two private nursing homes in the same locality and both are healthy.

April 24th is the day when Unique Home celebrates the Joint birthday for all girls in this Ashram. This celebration was on the way. The cake was ready to cut. Hundreds of people were gathered to participate. Suddenly Bibi Parkash Kaur (incharge of Unique Home) received a phone call that somebody left the newborn girl in the cradle at Unique Home.

This is announced to the crowd. The happiness and joy is seen on every face and people are congratulating that another newborn girl is saved. She was left in the cradle not thrown in the bush to die. She was brought into the celebration and named "HONEY".

Week after this 2nd girls was found in the bush near Jalandhar. She was immediately taken to a private clinic where she was being given medical treatment. She is also healthy. She is named "MAMTA".

Both girls are now the part of "Unique Home Family" where other 56 girls are living.

Few months back two girls were found near Ludhiana.

While one was found at bee farm in Ladowal area, the other was found at a vacant plot in Haibowal. Incidentally, both were four days old. The identity of their parents could not been known and they had been admitted to two private nursing homes in the same locality.

As the infant found in Haibowal around 11 am on Saturday was suffering from jaundice, According to the information, the first baby was first noticed lying in a vacant plot by a passerby, Adarsh (43), who after hearing her cries called a woman living in a house closeby.

The police was called in and the infant admitted to Yuvraj Nursing Home. Police sources said it is suspected that some couple might have thrown the baby after they came to know that it was a girl.

Dr Gurvinder Singh, medical superintendent of Yuvraj Nursing Home, said that the baby was suffering from jaundice and had been put on phototherapy machine. He added that all the blood tests were done and the reports were normal.

Investigating officer in the Haibowal case, Rajinder Prasad, said that the infant was found on Saturday afternoon when a complaint by the local resident came and there after the police has admitted the baby to the local nursing home. The second child was found in bee farm near Sidhwan Canal, Bains village. The owners of the farm, who stayed in Dashmesh Nagar, found the girl lying between two large bee-keeping boxes. The caretaker migrant labour noticed the infant around 1 am on Saturday night and informed the owner. Later, the wife of the owner, Gurdev Kaur, informed the police, who admitted her in Toor Hospital.
